What is the Technology User Group?

The Technology User Group, or TUG, is a group of library patrons that meet to discuss emerging assistive technologies and how the new technology will have a positive effect on the print impaired community.

When Do They Meet?

The Technology User Group meets on the 2nd (Second) Saturday of each month during the months between March and November. They typically meet in the LBPH meeting room. However, there are times where the group will meet at various locations across the state. These meetings are announced on the library's list-serve and website.
